Deep Creek Taking Care of Enrollment of More Than Three Hundred

CRADOCK SENDS LARGE NUMBER

The Deep Creek High School has enrolled more than 300 pupils for the current session, which opened a short time ago, the heaviest registration at the school in its history. The assignment of a large number of High School pupils from Cradock to Deep Creek has swelled the enrollment there. An arrangement was made with the Norfolk County school authorities for the teaching of the Cradock pupils at Deep Creek, instead of opening High School classes in the Cradock school.

Deep Creek, however, is not alone in a heavy enrollment for the current session. The other schools of Norfolk County have also reported heavy registration. Ninety-five of the 300 pupils in attendance at Deep Creek are enrolled in the High School department

Additions To Faculty

There have been changes made in the faculty and the following teachers have been added to the school: Miss Gladys Whaley, who is a graduate of the Farmville Normal School; Miss Mary Moore, of Randolph-Macon College; Miss Mary Virginia Johnson, who is also of Randolph-Macon College, and Miss Estelle Davis, of William and Mary.

The increase in the faculty has made it possible to offer twenty classes in the High School, besides four years of English, mathematics, history; three years of Latin and two years of science offered heretofore, the school is offering home economics, French and a business course.

Both faculty and students seem much interested in the school and the outlook for the year is very promising.
